- 2: Reconciliation work: Hope for Girls and Women in Tanzania staff in collaboration with Social welfare from Serengeti and Butiama District office, Police Gender desk officers and Community Development officers managed to conduct the reconciliation session meetings between parents and their daughters in various villages in Serengeti and Butiama, Total of 5 girls were reconciled and joined their families 4 new girls received. Total of 170 girls staying to both safe houses in the month of September.
- **3: Counseling session:** Hope for Girls and Women managed to provide counselling to 93 Girls where psychological support was provided to all survivors. I2 group Counseling sessions were conducted and 83 individual counselling sessions was conducted in Butiama and Serengeti.

- **3. Digital champions:** We managed to collaborate with the Digital Champions and village Volunteers by receiving GBV cases through their smartphones. We managed to receive the following cases as following.
 - At Butiama Safe House GBV Champion they reported 2 GBV cases.
 - Hope Mugumu Safe house GBV Champion they reported 0 GBV cases.
- **4: Legal issue:** HGWT team continued to collaborate to work with the Police Gender Desk Officers and Social Welfare Officer on the management of ongoing court proceedings of the cases of the victims by ensuring that they get their legal rights.
 - At Mugumu center in the court there are 7 ongoing cases.
 - At Butiama in the court there are 4 cases progressing to the court.
 - 5: Giving first aid and taking girls to the hospital.

Matrons and social welfare from Hope managed to give first aid to 5 girls. A total number 17 girls were taken to hospital for more treatment. two children from Butiama safe house was admitted to the hospital.

7: Soap making and Tailoring: Making practical soap for washing hands, 9 students are continuing to make soaps. Tailoring class girls making pumpers.


