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# **NUMBER OF GIRLS AT OUR SAFE HOUSES**

We ended November with 68 girls in the care of Mugumu safe house, during the month 4 new girls arrived:

 Information about girls from Wairege Clan being cut in November 2021 reached us in June, this is being monitored

# **LEGAL ISSUES**

- 1 rape case continues in Butiama while 1 Case finished.
- In Serengeti, 2 new FGM cases continue at court.
- 16 new cases were reported to the police after Digital Champion calls and reports (through ODK) in Mugumu and Butiama, where Social welfare officers are investigating

# SOCIAL WELFARE AND POLICE GENDER DESK OFFICE:

In collaboration with the Police Gender Desk officers and Social Welfare Officers we have been able to visit girls whom were returned back home but also visit families who rejected their daughters in Butiama, Serengeti and Tarime.

All girls whom were accepted by their families are doing fine and all continue well with their education.



# FORMAL EDUCATION AND VTC.

Hope for Girls and Women in Tanzania has managed to send girls to continue with their primary, secondary, high school, and vocational classes and to continue with the reading and writing class. The following are the categories of education.

To enable girls to continue with their education Hope supports them with material resources for school like exercise books, pens, books and other items.

7 Girls passed to join secondary education in January 2022.





# PRE FORM ONE CLASS

Pre form one Studies continue at Hope Mugumu Safe house and Butiama to 7 girls who finished primary school education to prepare our girls to join form one in January 2022.



# **TAILORING TRAINING**

A total of 22 girls received tailoring and entrepreneurship skills at the Safe Houses. This including training in how to make:

- pencil skirts
- bonefish dresses
- muslim clothes
- v-shaped skirts
- neck-tied skirts, neck-tie-blouse
- ronda dresses.



# **ENTREPRENEUR TRAINING**

During November in the entrepreneur class we taught the following:

- Who is an entrepreneur and how to become a successful entrepreneur
- Marketing skills

# **COUNSELLING SESSIONS**

Girls at the safe houses were counselled weekly, this was done in two ways; Individual counselling and group counselling. We try as much as possible to keep the girls close in all ways so that they can enjoy staying at Safe House.

We listen to the challenges they face and try to look for possible solutions.

A total of 4 counselling sessions were conducted in Butiama Safe House and a total of 54 girls received group counselling, 13 girls received individual counselling.

In Mugumu a total of 4 counselling sessions were conducted and a total of 65 girls received group counselling and individual counselling.





# **AGRICULTURE**

Both safe houses continue to manage the agriculture activities in Butiama and Serengeti growing varieties of different vegetables from the gardens.





# **COLLABORATIONS**

Hope for Girls and Women has been working in collaboration with other partners such as Plaster house, NaCoNCO, VSO Clarity project.



#### **Plaster House**

In September, Plaster House treated three children from different villages for ailments including cleft palate and joint issues.



#### NaCONGO - Mara

The Hope for Girls and Women team is working to collect data for NGOs across the Mara region and identifying areas of capacity building. This work is being done as part of the National Council of NGOs in Tanzania (NaCONGO).





# Providing a safe and healthy environment for girls from FGM and other forms of violence.

Health services were provided to all children whom found with health problems after check up to the hospital were treated. Medication to sick girls was done too. Health checkups conducted to girls during girls follow ups.



#### Programme Management and reconciliation:

Hope for Girls and Women in Tanzania in collaboration with, Social welfare officer, police gender desk conducted reconciliation between girls and their parents. No any girls taken home hence the month of FGM in some clans.



Support safe house with volunteers' allowances

2 staff were paid [ Roadshow assistance and Director]

**Empowering communities to adopt positive social norms** which uphold the human rights of all community members through community sensitization and public declarations against FGM by respected community leaders by hosting 26 celebration ceremonies in 13 clans for two years.

- 2 clan meetings were conducted to create awareness to respected traditional leaders, in order to declare against FGM to Ngoreme and Nyabasi in Serengeti and Butiama.
- 6 ARPs ceremonies planned to be conducted in small groups in Serengeti and Butiama in December and early January 2022.





School programs were conducted to identify girls at risk of being cut in this month of December 2021. This helped to create awareness and inform the community that FGM is Illegal. As part of this program, we issue young people with a 'Health Passport' - this includes information about FGM and how to seek help if you feel you're at risk.
